I particularly need people to help me with Show & Tell sessions and am asking that different people volunteer rather than have the same people for both morning and afternoon sessions. Refreshments will be easy as there is no money changing hands, it will be just making the teas and coffees - biscuits will be there for people to help themselves.


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Name Badges

February Guest Speaker— Bec Wilken
Executive Manager of Client Services at SAFVC



Bec Wilken, the Executive Manager of Client Services at SAFVC (Sexual Assault & Family Violence Centre) spoke to the members about the types of services offered to (predominantly) women and children who have been unwilling targets for violence and their need for a safe, secure refuge where they can reorganise their lives.

Not all of them will escape from their violent partners, some will try to make the relationship work. It takes on average eight attempts to leave before many will make the final break and possibly seek refuge at the Centre's very private units while they

undergo counselling along with advice on setting up their new home base, getting help with jobs and with managing finances and the practicalities of providing for their families.


She also spoke about the units, how they're set up, what the 'turnover' time is for the occupants and how the quilts we make are a part of the Centre's focus on given the units a feeling of 'home' to these women and their children.

She thanked the Guild for it's ongoing support through the quilt programme.

It was good of Bec to give up her Saturday afternoon to talk to us and to see the latest quilt gifts donated on the day, that will be part of the larger consignment that I have ready to take to the Centre's headquarters in the next couple of weeks.





The Foundation logo is purple, pink and features a gerbera flower.

Challenge Theme—Peace of Mind

The challenge is to create a 12 1/2 inch block relating to the above theme. The predominant colour to be used is PUR-PLE. You can incorporate as many colours as you wish and use whichever technique you love doing.

Blocks will be displayed at the Quilt-In and then made into a quilt for Charity.

6 1/2 inch squares

This year you have a choice, you can:
Donate some 6 1/2inch squares
Donate some fabric to be cut into 6 1/2inch square

Join in a session using the Go-Cutter to cut the squares. The Go-Cutter will be set up in the Library Room at the March and April meetings .



MYSTERY QUILT: PART 4 ANNE CLUTTERBUCK

Well done to those of you who are attempting the Mystery QuiltBelow is the final instalment of instructions for you to put together the 16 blocks you are making (or have already made) from all those half square triangles. Again, I apologise for making such a dog's breakfast of the third instalment – this one is much simpler now that you have the block construction diagram that I sent out by email after I discovered my error with the 3rd Instalment. I will put it in again below.



You are making a 4 block x 4 block quilt top that you can add any border of your own desire or you can follow what I have done. The photo of my quilt top is below.



When putting the blocks together you need to alternate the direction of each second block. If you follow my finished quilt for layout you will understand how it comes together.

You can see the star pattern emerging at the junction of four blocks - if you have kept enough of one colour for these stars, work out how to place each block to get that specifically coloured star. I did decide to have specific star colours, so matched my reds, greens, blues or greys accordingly. Hopefully you have all made a good mix of colours to create that design.

I am looking forward to seeing how you have all interpreted the instructions given I did not dictate that you must make at least 4 of Unit 1 in one colour to create that star.

I have added 3 borders, the first two are 1 % inch strips, when finished they measure 1 inch across. I added 1 % inch squares in a contrasting colour to the corners of the 2nd border to give a bit of interest and the wider 3rd border is 4 % inch strips, that once finished will measure 4 inches across.

I haven't decided yet whether I will use the same border fabric to bind the quilt or whether I will use a contrasting colour. All these decisions are yours to make to make this quilt your own.

I hope you have enjoyed the journey... and that you are happy with the final 'product'. I've learned a lot about running a Mystery Quilt and if you decide I should do another one, I will know better how to keep you all guessing to the last, without making a mess of the instructions.

Linen pack bags 60x80cm. Drawstring needs to be long enough to open bag fully.

St John of God Hospital Oncology Quilts Sue Palmer

Quilts which are donated to patients in the Oncology Ward need to be 60×60 inches.

The quilts provide comfort the patients while they are receiving their treatment and are given to them to keep.

The most asked for colours are purple, blue and green but all colours are accepted.

Quilts have been donated since 2018, at the end of 2023 a total of 266 quilts have been delivered (not including some Yetty delivered from Seachange in Barwon Heads). Congratulations to the Guild members, Bellarine Quilters and Seachange.

AUSSIE HERO QUILTS Sue Palmer

Aussie Heroes has been up and running since January2012 . Aussie Hero Quilts (and Laundry Bags) has continued to grow steadily.

Quilt Size:


The quilts were designed to be portable and easy to post. Anything posted to the members with an AFPO address and under 2kg is free.

Aussie Hero Quilts are sized to be the width of the fabric so about 42". The length should be 70". I know some of you will think that this size seems a little narrow, but the quilts also have to be small enough for the recipients to fit into their luggage if they are required to move from one location to another unexpectedly. They also need to be the right size to fit on top of a navy bunk at sea and a bunk bed or stretcher on land. If you make the quilts too wide this makes them too big and bulky.

Every Quilt must have an Aussie Hero label on it as follows:

This is an
AUSSIE HERO QUILT
Made for an Aussie Hero .
With gratitude for your service

If Aussie Hero Quilts is something you would like to get involved with speak to Sue Palmer. The Aussie Hero Quilts website is very comprehensive with tutorials available on how to make quilt blocks and also quilt patterns.


We don't have many library rules but we feel we must introduce a new one. Books and magazines are not to be removed from the library room for browsing at your table. If they leave the room they must be borrowed.


