As this is the first newsletter for 2025, I will wish you all a belated Happy New Year! I hope everyone had wonderful family times, a lot of great food and maybe the odd wine ??! I hope Santa was kind and brought you things you wanted or needed and not things you are wondering who you can regift them to next Christmas (I have been guilty of doing that occasionally!) Our Christmas meeting went well. You all seemed very happy with the boxed lunch and I think you enjoyed the fun on the day. Many thanks to our talented ukele player and leader of the carol singing, Judy Alcock!

I was very honoured to be invited by the Bellarine Quilters to be their guest at their annual Christmas luncheon – a delicious buffet lunch (with a small glass of wine of course!). Thankyou ladies of the Bellarine Quilters – it was such a pleasure to be a part of your Christmas festivities.

We are starting the year off with a popular quilter, Irene Blanck, as our speaker and I'm looking forward to hearing her story. Irene will also be our 'tutor' for the first workshop this year. March 22 at Newcomb

Hall – the eager participants will be learning her traditional Kawandi quilt technique. Irene's heritage is from the Siddhi people, whose ancestry goes back to the Bantu of East Africa who were taken to India as slaves many hundreds of years ago. Kawandi is a craft practised by the Siddhi. Hopefully we will learn more about Irene's background in her presentation. But Kawandi is not her only specialty. Irene does beautiful applique quilts so hers will be a very interesting 'journey'. There are still a couple of places for her workshop should you be interested – see me at the meeting!

In January we had nearly 40 attend the sit and sew – which, as is customary, was also the committee's principal organising of the May Quilt In meeting. You will find plenty of information about Quilt In in this newsletter, about the Challenge, and about our guest speaker. Sadly we learned that Tania Tanti, who was engaged to be our guest speaker, has been recently diagnosed with a major health issue that will require surgery. So we have needed to find an alternative speaker, which at this late stage, was going to be very difficult. However, as we had already confirmed Veronique Diligent as a trader at Quilt In, we asked her if she would be willing to also be our guest speaker. Thankfully she agreed. I know how much you all enjoyed her presentation back in October, so I hope you will be happy to see her gorgeous quilts and listen to her humorous story again in May, and bring along all your friends to admire her work. The winner of the Members' Choice Award was Annette Packett and the President's Award went to Pam Planner







#### **February Guest Speaker**

#### Irene Blanck

I live in Melbourne, Australia. I have been quilting for the last 30 years and enjoyed and learned all techniques, from machine piecing, English Paper Piecing, Foundation Piecing and Needleturn Applique. I started designing my own applique quilts in 2007 and was asked to teach my first quilt. I haven't looked back since then.

I enjoy teaching all aspects of needleturn applique and instilling in quilters the love for needleturn applique. I try and run my classes as sit and sew sessions where we have a fun and relaxing day, chatting to friends as well as learning new techniques or perfecting on learned techniques. I am now expanding into prepared edge applique as well as my version of "template" applique. I teach all the shortcuts that I've learnt over the years — mostly from making mistakes along the way and having to re-do sewing over and over.



I have been extremely fortunate to have had a book published by Quiltmania in 2015 – called "Focus on Applique". This helped launch my international career.

I have also had some quilts published in magazines in Australia and Europe, recently in Today's Quilter, a magazine from the UK.

I have taught extensively in the USA, Europe and here in Australia.



# AUSSIE HERO QUILTS Sue Palmer

Aussie Heroes has been up and running since January2012 . Aussie Hero Quilts (and Laundry Bags) has continued to grow steadily.

These days quilts and laundry bags are mailed mostly

#### **Quilt Size:**

The quilts were designed to be portable and easy to post. Anything posted to the members with an AFPO address and under 2kg is free.

Aussie Hero Quilts are sized to be the width of the fabric so about 42". The length should be 70". I know some of you will think that this size seems a little narrow, but the quilts also have to be small enough for the recipients to fit into their luggage if they are required to move from one location to another unexpectedly. They also need to be the right size to fit on top of a navy bunk at sea and a bunk bed or stretcher on land. If you make the quilts too wide this makes them too big and bulky.

Every Quilt must have an Aussie Hero label on it as follows:

This is an
AUSSIE HERO QUILT
Made for an Aussie Hero .

If Aussie Hero Quilts is something you would like to get involved with speak to Sue Palmer. The Aussie Hero Quilts website is very comprehensive with tutorials available on how to make quilt blocks and also quilt patterns.




#### March workshop.
